Teams are starting to form for Fleche Pacifica annual Randonneur event - the first meeting is scheduled for January 27th at Zeeks Pizza in Greenwood. Greg Sneed is seeking seniors for his team so he can kick some Canadian Geriatric butt. Lynn is still interested in a group of folks doing a trip to Europe together and renting a chateau as a base of ride - if your interested in helping her plan such an adventure get in touch with Lynn.

Upcoming Meetings: Susan Cady took a sabbatical and went on the Odyssey 2000 event - she has lots to tell about her bike ride around the world. In March we will be having Estelle Grey speak on proper bike fit.

Meeting was adjourned around 8:15 and part of the group hustled home on the Burke Gilman - before their lights burned out.

RCC Board Meeting - January 25th

Meeting ran from 7:30 p.m. to 9:00pm - George Thornton, Tom Killion, Charlie Buchalter & Amy Harman present.

Club Bylaws and Articles of Inc. have been updated and George will be bringing them to the February meeting to be signed off on, they may need minor changes. Charlie suggested we have them looked over by an independent contractor that works with Cascade - George is confident that the attorney RCC hired to put them together has done a competent job.

Ramrod 2000 - Tom Killion brought in the final report about how the ride went with suggestions for 2001 - I will submit a copy for our records.

Ramrod 2001 - Registration will be online with a bounce back email that contains the waiver to be signed and mailed with the payment for registration.

RCC Checking - Charlie needs to have a few people changed on the signature cards; found out that Washington Mutual needs to prepare the forms ahead of time so he will bring the change forms to the February meeting.

Voice mail: The club voicemail account has become expensive \$28.00 a month for 2 boxes and has a short billing cycle - Charlie is checking with another company the Evergreen Tandem Club will be using - only \$10.00 a month per box and easier to access. George also offered use of his office phone system for a voice mail box. At this point no final decisions were made.

Donations: Looking into doing a visible donation for next year - such as bike racks to Mt. Rainier park.

Treasurer report: between the 2 accounts RCC & Ramrod we have over \$49,000 dollars. Tom Killion is going to look into some conservative investments so we can earn a little more interest on our funds in the off season. We thought of some club investments to make with a portion of the money. Jazz up the webpage, Promote membership, New Club brochure - looking into all 3.

Expo: We have 2 booths side by side - one for RCC / S2S / Cannonball the second for Ramrod. We got a booth with Electricity so we can have a computer at the Ramrod booth. Tom Killion is organizing staffing. It was also brought up that we should get some new banners and perhaps have the March RCC newsletter done at the printer for a better quality - these two issues are being looked into.

New Meeting Place: It has been brought up again that we may want to

look for a new place to hold our monthly meeting that is closer to the I-5 corridor. We are going to investigate a few different places - we would also like to find a place that is friendly to cycle too.

The backroads by where we live are fantastic as they wind through forest with virtually no car traffic. However, you have to watch out for water buffalo, cobras, giant flying stinging attacking pissed off bugs not to mention the cattle herds and sudden electrical storms.

But.....NO DOGS!!!! People eat them over here. Some of the guys I work with were at a party in Alor Setar and they had a dog roasting on a spit....I was thinking that I would love to have a picture and send it in to a cycling publication saying something like "This is what happens to dogs that chase cyclists over here.....Tonight we're having filet of Fido". Alex was here, oh, let's see, 4 days before he was taken to the hospital with a severe sun burn.....well, we warned him but would he listen. We think he'll listen now...I now refer to him as "Leper Boy". Two nights ago we were invited to a very posh party in Alor Setar to celebrate Chinese New Years. The house was an absolute palace and the food and drinks were absolute first class.

There were about 200 guests including "The Princess" who happens to be the Sultan of Kedah's wife. I had to have my picture taken by her car which had a very simple gold plated license which read "Sultan Kedah Darul Aman" (ours reads KBA 4315). The party was so loud shooting off illegal fireworks and all that the police (polis) showed up, but upon seeing "The Princesses" car they immediately split. Robyn got to meet "The Princess" and Mary Jo (Brian's wife....another Hexcel guy) bugged "The Princess" into setting up a golf date between Brian and "The Sultan"....is nothing sacred? Mountain Bikers Win! IMBA Campaign Reverses BLM Plan

After receiving more than 10,000 comments from mountain bikers in 30 days, the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) has decided not to categorize mountain bikes with motorized vehicles in a controversial new management plan.

The International Mountain Bicycling Association (IMBA) mobilized an effective campaign to change the draft policy. IMBA was concerned that the BLM's plan to link mountain biking and motorized policies would have led to unwarranted access restrictions and served as a negative precedent.

Many Washington State mountain bikers responded to IMBA's call to action. Kudos to Backcountry Bicycle Trails Club (BBTC) and other local groups who mobilized their members to take action.
